ISTIH brings together a multidisciplinary approach to managing aid projects with the ability to facilitate international health and other aid projects in related sectors. This institute collaborates with, and has alliances among governments and non-government organisations (NGOs), Australian and regional institutes and universities, bilateral donors, multilateral agencies and global foundations, to foster health policy and planning for the betterment of low to middle income countries. With these alliances ISTIH aims to provide a holistic approach to the provision of services to the aid sector.

Further to the delivery of a diverse number of global aid resources, one of the primary purposes of the International Skills and Training Institute in Health (ISTIH) is to provide assistance in the development of skills and training resources in developing nations. ISTIH's footprint covers the Asia Pacific region, with a critical focus on the closer neighbours of Australia.



About ISTIH

It was initially founded under the umbrella of three major Western Australian resources; The University of Western Australia, Curtin University of Technology and the Health Department of Western Australia via the Office of the Chief Medical Officer. This co-operation facilitates cross-campus and cross-community collaboration, avoiding unnecessary competition, yet ISTIH is now growing beyond the foundation of its initial partners.



A Board of Governors heads the Institute and is supported by an Executive Management Committee, who are experts in medical education, nurse education, pharmacy, disaster management and other disciplines.

With the extensive collective experiences of the Board of Governors, across academia and both the public and private sectors, it engages a significant number of health professionals, both locally, nationally and internationally.
